## FUND MANAGERS' COMMENTARY

### Equity Outlook:

The fiscal year ended with high note for equities as it scaled all time high level. Perhaps it could not have come at any other year which is marked with significant volatility across all the asset classes. Macro economic numbers have worsened during this period. Country has also witnessed trend setting political outcome through election of a year old party ruling the govt. in national capital. The year also saw stability and growth to EU and US economy respectively and opened new chapter of tapering and end to multiyear fiscal stimulus by US Fed authorities. India landed itself into the club of fragile five.

The unprecedented currency volatility that threatened the very basics of fiscal stability and current account deficit has been finally and successfully brought under control by deft handling by the new incumbent at Mint Street. The nation has also witnessed synchronized efforts between FM and Governor in mitigating this challenge with innovative use of monetary and fiscal tools. Outcome of this has amply reflected in India's best performance across equities and currencies. India remained at the top among emerging market economies and the case for being part of the fragile five has become weak for now.

While the year has witnessed worst GDP numbers in last one decade questioning economy's ability to sustain 8% growth rate. The stability in currency and inflation control has infused confidence among global investors with green shoots of economy that is beginning to sprout and bets on country's economic recovery is only heightened further. FIIs have pumped unprecedented liquidity in Indian market. What has also caught the nation's imagination is general election 2014. The political discourse that main opposition party has promised to bring the growth agenda has been lapped up by the market. Markets continued the march to all time high levels.

There is recovery hope and there is optimism that economy will come out from one of the worst down cycle that we have witnessed in recent times. The hope is also for the new government to revive the investment cycle and bring the good governance. Significant out performances by Banks, Infrastructure, Capital Goods, Constructions, Realty and mid cap and small caps reflect this sentiment in the market. Whoever comes to the power the challenges of the economies are well documented and equally the solutions. Country would like to see growth, governance, political and economic stability from the new government to fire the aspiration of billions plus citizens of this country.

### Fixed Income:

**From the brink :** As one looks back at the last financial year, one is left wondering at the remarkable pullback from the brink that the Indian financial markets witnessed. It was script gone almost horribly wrong: and what started it was from the most unlikely quarter; the talks of US Federal Reserve's tapering. And India with its worsening CAD suddenly found itself being deemed as a fragile economy. It saw huge rupee volatility (amidst weakness) and selling by FII's in the debt segment in July. The RBI reacted sharply by restricting access to overnight repo liquidity available with RBI and increasing spread corridor between Repo and MSF effectively raising short term rates by close to 200 basis. It was an unconventional monetary tool the efficacy of which was questioned for its efficacy. In addition, RBI and the Government also introduced curbs on gold imports to put a lid on the worsening trade deficits.

The year also saw a paradigm shift in the conduct of monetary policy. Paradigm breaking is always a difficult and delicate job; and with a new Governor at the helm, it wasn't going to be easy. The Governor articulated his resolve to use monetary tools to curb retail inflation measured by CPI and was unambiguous in his stand that the growth-inflation trade off was a "false trade off" and that the monetary policy would have an Argus eye on the retail inflation. The Urjit Patel committee report too broadly focused on this aspect on inflation targeting monetary authority. It was indeed a break from the past mould of balancing between growth and inflation.

And yes, as the year progressed we pulled back remarkably. The CAD numbers improved dramatically aided ironically by the weaker rupee and a strong global demand, fiscal redline was followed (with some jugglery) and retail inflation also eased. However, with around 75 basis hike in the repo rates, long term rates increased by around 100 basis points in the financial year.

### Quo Vadis

Quo Vadis : whither goest thou. This financial year will witness elections and any crystal gazing is prone to risk. Remarkably we start off much stronger because

- CAD has fallen to comfortable levels and even if curbs on Gold imports are lifted, should not have damaging effects
- A not so strong rupee can ensure export competitiveness assuming a continued global strength
- Food inflation which was the most damaging within CPI seems to have been reined in: empirically gathered from lower rural income growth and low MSP increases
- The US Fed is already on with the tapering; so we have that firmly behind us

And yet we probably have chinks in the armour :

- Election outcome
- Possible El nino effects on agricultural commodities prices
- The lack of buying of GOI securities by RBI through OMO will put a cap on long term rates
- China still presents an unclear picture
- Equity markets led by US show weakness

The future will always remain uncertain: with uncertainty also rests hopes: hopes of a better, prosperous nation.

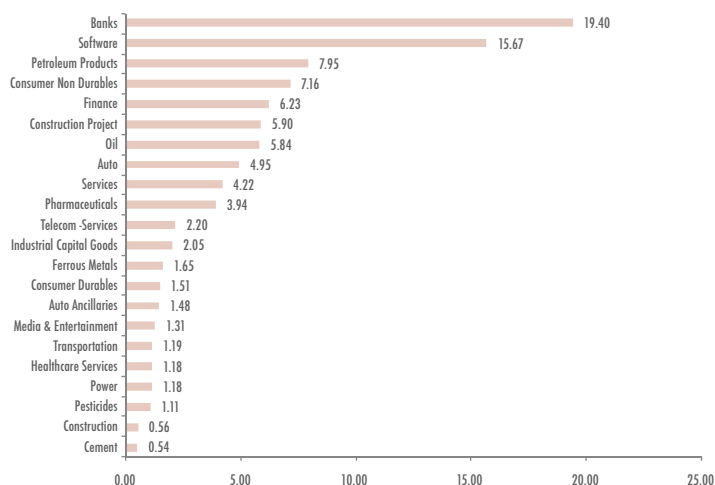

**Fund Manager's Comment:** True to its mandate, the portfolio maintained its character for infrastructure themes. The recent effort in pushing massive infrastructure project has induced positive sentiments in the sector. The significant policy reforms in coal, gas and power sector is providing significant boost to the sectors future outlook. Sector has been under pressure since last few years due to multiple factors. There is no major change in portfolio constructions. Infrastructure remains an important pillar of India growth story and we have strong conviction of come back in near future. Steps have been already initiated by the policy makers to fast forward the clearance and remove the hurdles on the ground to revive the cycle again. 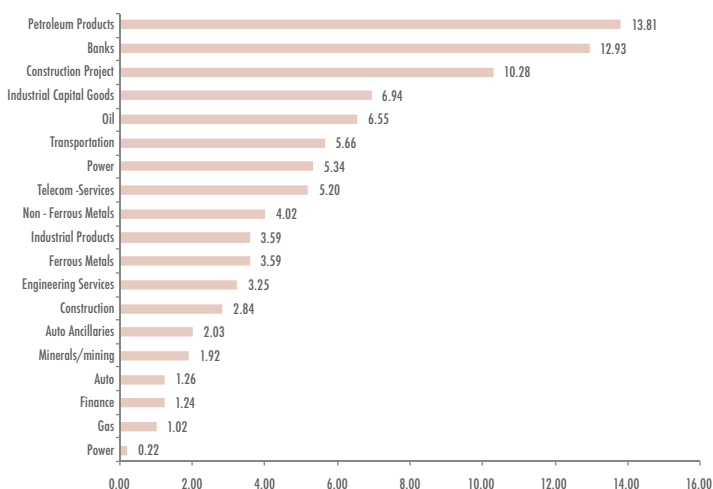

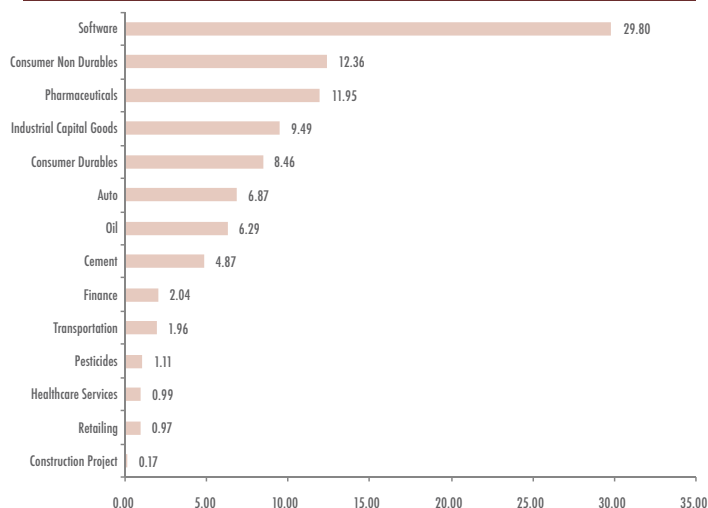

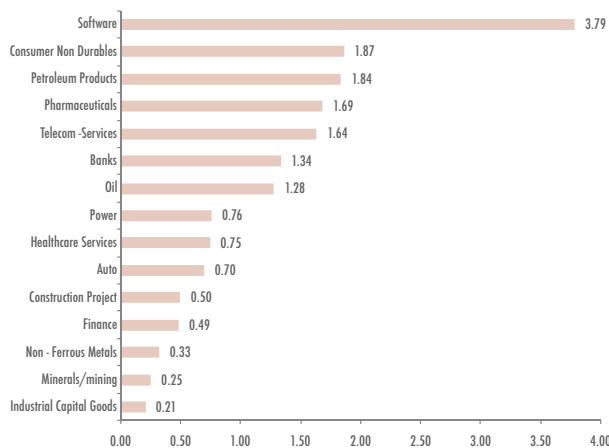
